Homework Policy

Government guidance recommends that all schools have a policy on homework. The guidelines suggest that children aged 5 to 7 should be set an hour a week, rising to half-an-hour a night for 7 to 11 year olds.

At Emmanuel Holcombe we have a consistent and progressive approach to homework, outlined below.

				Year 6 may receive additional homework in Spring Term before SATs in May
Phonics	At the end of each week a flashcard will be sent home and a support sheet posted onto Seesaw. There will be a short paper-based phonics task sent home on a Friday. Word lists, decodable and common exception words, are included for the children to practise reading and writing. Reading	Reading books are changed every Monday.	Reading books are changed every Monday. There is an expectation to complete Rhino challenges and post to seesaw – this is to support comprehension. Each Friday homework is set on Seesaw based on the current week's times tables. Times table tests are completed on a Friday.
