

We hope you had a good summer break and we extend a warm welcome to all our families, both new and familiar. Our monthly newsletter aims to keep you informed about activities and events at school. Willow Classroom

As you may be aware, Willow Classroom has undergone a full renovation over the summer holidays, partially funded by our fantastic PTA, and we are delighted with the result. Please feel free to pop into Willow classroom on Tuesday 12th September, during class 'drop-ins' to have a look, (even if your child isn't in that class).

Uniform

It has been lovely to see all of the children arriving at school in their smart, new uniforms. Please label all items. We strongly believe that pride in our uniform inspires pride in our school and we will be celebrating excellent uniform standards. Please note that we do not expect logoed uniform. Plain red jumpers/cardigans and plain white polo shirts are perfectly acceptable and our PTA hold regular pre-loved uniform sales in school. We are here to support you; so please speak to a member of staff if you have any concerns regarding uniform.

Punctuality and the school ramp

School opens at 8.45am and all children are encouraged to arrive at this time. This allows children to put their belongings away, start their early morning tasks and be ready for learning. Registration is at 8.55am. If children arrive after 8.55am they must enter school via the office and they will receive a late mark in the register.

Please can we request that pupils do not access the ramp before 8.45am, as the school premises are not officially open to pupils until this time, and therefore children are not insured.

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Attendance

You may be aware that the government have stipulated that schools must have robust systems in place for promoting good attendance. Good attendance is considered to be between 98%-100%. Persistent absence is considered below 90%. A report by Ofsted stated that the most impactful approach to improving attendance is to, 'listen, understand, empathise and support – but not to tolerate'. We will be sharing attendance figures throughout the year.

'Reading: the gateway to learning':

Reading is the gateway to learning anything about everything. It helps children discover new things, educate themselves in any area of life they are interested in and enables them to access the full curriculum. We understand the tremendous time pressures on young families and that finding time to read is not always easy, but as educators, we implore you to prioritise this one task over the next academic year. Daily reading with your child not only improves progress in all areas -it accelerates progress. Please come into school and meet with us if you need any help in establishing the daily habit of reading and we will happily support you in any way we can.

A BIG Thank You

A huge congratulations and heartfelt thank you to Nick Di-Nardo, an Emmanuel parent, who cycled 140 miles, completing the Coast to Coast challenge in July. Thanks to Nick's fantastic fundraising efforts, almost £1,000 has been raised for school. Plus, the company he works for has also donated £1,000. The money has been spent on the Willow class refurbishment, which has significantly enhanced the learning environment for our pupils.

Medication

We would like to remind parents that whilst we are able to administer any medication that is prescribed by your child's doctor or hospital, we cannot give anything that is 'bought over the counter'. All medication must be brought to the school office by an adult who will be asked to complete a 'Request For School To Administer Prescribed Medication' form, (this is available from the Office or can be downloaded from our website). To ensure the safety of our pupils, all medication is kept in the staffroom, this ensures that all staff are aware of any health needs. A Health Care Plan will be put in place if necessary.

Medicines should be clearly marked with the name of the pupil, together with the dosage and the time of day at which it should be taken. School cannot accept medicine that has been taken out of the original container.

If required, parents can visit the school during the day to administer any medication like paracetamol.

If your child needs <u>ongoing</u> medication for conditions such as asthma, medication must be stored in school rather than being sent in daily in their school bag. An additional set of medicine should be available from your Doctor. Medication stored in school is stored centrally with a plan for its use which is known to all staff. Medication and health Care Plans go off-site whenever your child does. For any medication sent into school, whether for an ongoing condition or a temporary illness, parents must also complete the school form referred to above.

Sickness

Please can we remind you that if your child has suffered with sickness or diarrhoea, it is really important that you do not send them into school until they have had at least **48 hours** of being clear of any sickness or diarrhoea. This is in line with guidance from Public Health England. As a school we will send them home if we feel they are not fit to be in school. Thanks for your continued co-operation.

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School Dinners

School Dinners: The price of a school meal for Years 3 to 6 is now £2.50 per day. Cost per week for school dinners is £12.50. School dinners are payable in advance and prompt payment is essential. You can choose to pay either weekly, monthly or for a half term. Payments should be made online to the Bury MBC website. When you are paying online, please pay under the correct category. We have had some incidences of payments for dinner money paid into trips and vice versa, which causes problems. If you require a further copy of the instructions and your child's UPN, please contact the school office.

School Milk

At the end of July, we were informed that our milk provider had ceased trading with immediate effect. We have now secured a new milk supplier. However, this means that we are unlikely to receive any milk supplies for the first few weeks of term whilst the administrations process is completed. We will update you as soon as we have any further information.

Contact Information

Please remember to inform the school office of any changes to your contact details as soon as possible. This ensures that we can contact the relevant parent/carer when necessary.

Pupils are asked to wear their normal school uniform but with a pair of jeans instead of their normal school trousers / skirt. In return we are asking for a donation of £1 to support the Jeans for Genes campaign.

We have supported this charity for years and the children have always enjoyed wearing their jeans for the day, we hope that your child/ren can participate.

Oak Class

Also, if a child is bringing a mobile phone into school for the purpose of safety whilst walking home, they must hand this in to Mrs Bulmer as they enter in the morning, and your child will be able to collect it at home time.

School Book Bags

Due to space in school, we ask that children use a book bag to bring their learning to and from school rather than any other type of bag. Book bags can be purchased from school using the online payment system. Unfortunately, our suppliers have increased the price of the book bags. A KS1 bag is £7.00 and the KS2 bag is £7.75. Once you have made the payment we will send the book bag home with your child.
